




What is the Local Transport Plan?




- Forms the framework for investment in local transport schemes
- Main source of funding for local transport schemes
- Statutory requirement
- Annual allocation from Central Government
- Contains a vision, objectives, targets and indicators
- Structured around journey purpose and the reason people travel
- Underpinned by supporting strategies and evidence base



What are Local Area Transport Plans?



- Take the high level strategy in the LTP and apply it to local areas
- Highlight local problems and issues
- These translate into a long list of schemes we may seek to deliver
- Contain a programme of measures to be implemented over the timeframe of the Plan




















What has been delivered to date?



Public transport improvements

 General bus stop improvements including raised kerbs at stops on Bedford Road, London Road, and St Neots Road

Cycle improvements

- Various small scale works including footway widening to enable shared use
- 20mph limits outside schools

Freight improvements

- Production of freight study
- Waiting restrictions on Girthford Bridge















What schemes are planned in 2014/15?




- Real time information displays
 - £50,000 allocated across Biggleswade and Sandy
- Sandy to Potton cycleway
 - £25,000 allocation in the LATP
 - Additional £25,000 in the Potton LATP

East - West Rail update



Purpose

- Improve connectivity and capacity
- Stimulate economic growth
- Cater for movement of freight

Phases

- Eastern section (Ipswich / Norwich to Cambridge)
- Central section (Cambridge to Bedford)
- Western section (Oxford to Bedford)















East - West Rail update



Western Section

- Funding committed
- To be in place by 2019
- Route will be electrified
- Preparatory work is underway
- Station at Ridgmont serving Central Bedfordshire

Central Section

- Anticipated to be in place by 2024
- Consultants are currently looking at route options
- There is no defined route alignment at present
