

# 1. Mayor's Overview of the Work of Sandy Town Council 2011/2012

### **Democracy**

The role of Sandy Town Council is to promote Sandy and Beeston and to work with relevant partners to enhance our town and the experience of those people who live and work here. The 15 Town Councillors are elected volunteers who work for no financial reward and give their time and talents for the benefit of their community.

Over the past year Sandy Town Council has met 12 times and has held over 30 committee and working group meetings.

In May 2011 elections were held and these were contested in two wards. This left one vacancy in Pinnacle ward which was filled by co-option at a meeting on 1 August 2011. Cllr Mrs J Smyth was selected from a strong field of 4 candidates.

During the year Town Councillors have regularly represented STC on the following outside bodies:

as well as attending other events to represent the Town Council.

Earlier this year the Town Council adopted new standing orders and a new committee structure and scheme of delegations has been agreed which will be used with effect from the Annual Meeting of the Council in May 2012. It is hoped that these new internal arrangements will streamline and speed up

council decision making and share the workload between Councillors more effectively.

### **Communications**

As part of our representative and consultative role Sandy Town Council has communicated and engaged with the community during the year in several ways.

Councillor surgeries have been held on a regular monthly cycle either in the Town Council Offices or more recently in the Sandy Library. Also members of the public have attended Town Council meetings, asked questions during our public forum and written to the Council to seek information. We have communicated with our residents by means of newsletters and latterly via a regular page in the Sandy Bulletin. The decision to cease publication of the "Yellow Bulletin" announcing the Annual Parish Meeting and to present a new style of Annual Report was taken during the year in order to ensure that the Council's annual report is published in a more cost effective and timely fashion.

The Town Council's website which was designed over 10 years ago has been undergoing refurbishment and the new look website will be relaunched soon.

We have also encouraged visitors to the Town Council offices and our Tourist Information Centre where information about our locality and our services can be provided face to face. Our offices have also been hired by a range of community groups and organisations for meetings.

### **Finance**

The Council's accounts for 2011/12 are shown later in the report. Our spending plans for 2011/12 were extremely tight and did not allow scope for many new projects or improvements to existing facilities. Capital resources were spent on improving footway lighting in the town and the Town Council gave a number of community grants to support local initiatives such as the swimming programme at Sandy Place School as well as a significant contribution to the Christmas Lights organised by Sandy Chamber of Trade.


Given the current financial climate the budget for 2012/13 has been set with a similar regard for financial prudence and our desire to provide value for money for the taxpayers of Sandy during a period of recession. A small increase in

the precept set for 2012/13 was necessary to combat our increasing costs particularly the rising cost of fuel and utilities but staff pay rates still remain frozen at the 2009 scale and we have made as many savings as we believe to be compatible with a minimum level of good service.

In December 2011 we were made aware that the community of Sandy had qualified for a grant from the central government Community First funding stream. This amounts to £16,000 over four years and the funds will be allocated to local community projects which strengthen the community resilience of Sandy and increase its social capital. A Sandy Community First Panel composed of Town Councillors and residents has been established to distribute this funding which will be spent in line with the priorities identified in the Sandy Community First Plan.

### **Allotments**

The search for a new allotment site for Sandy has continued. So far it has not proved possible to acquire suitable land through private purchase and at present the Town Council continues to work with Central Bedfordshire Council in the hope of securing a site from their estates. Several sites have been under active consideration during the past year, unfortunately a site has not yet been secured and existing allotment tenants were given an extension to their tenancies up until October 2012. STC remains committed to securing a new site and developing this for the benefit of the community. The reasons for wanting a new site are twofold, one so that the existing cemetery can be extended and two so that more people can enjoy the benefits of gardening and growing their own produce.

The development of a community orchard is also still under consideration and a site in Beeston has been identified however, this project remains subject to Central Bedfordshire Council's willingness to release the land for community use for this purpose.

# **Cemetery**

The Council continues to act as a Burial Authority and there have been 26 burials and 17 interments of ashes in Sandy Cemetery during the past year. The Chapel has been used for funeral services during summer months. Capacity within the cemetery is now limited and purchase of graves continues to be restricted to immediate burials until such time as the cemetery can be extended when the existing allotment site is vacated.

# **Community Safety**

Concerns about community safety have been significant this year and the Town Council has continued to fund CCTV coverage of the Town Centre and at Sunderland Road Recreation Ground. CI Neil Wareing of Bedfordshire Police attended a Council meeting in spring 2011 and in response to concerns about policing in Sandy agreed to site a temporary Police Pod in the Council's Town Centre Car Park. This meant PCSOs could provide a dedicated surgery in the town and could use the Pod as a base for their activities. The Council has

continued to communicate regularly and frequently with our neighbourhood policing team to raise concerns about anti-social behaviour in the town and we are working with the Community Safety Team at Central Bedfordshire Council on several initiatives to improve confidence in community safety.

### **Market and Town Centre Facilities**

During 2011/12 market revenues from the Friday market and the monthly Farmer's market have continued to decline. The Town Council discussed the future of the markets during the year and agreed to review the subject again in April 2012. Since then the Sandy Town Team has been established and has begun campaigning for the regeneration of the market. The Town Council is alert to the concerns of many residents and businesses within Sandy about the future viability of the Town Centre. We continue to maintain the Town Centre Car Park which is aimed at providing short term parking for shoppers and we maintain the Town Centre Toilets for the benefit of the community who are using the Town Centre. The Town Council has established links with the Town Team and our championing of the Walkers are Welcome campaign is intended to boost economic activity within the town centre.

The Town Council has provided seasonal horticultural displays throughout the town centre, cemetery and churchyard. The Sandy Enhancement Group has also contributed to Sandy's appearance and a highlight this year was the formal opening of the Station Triangle display.

### **Public Open Space and Recreational Facilities**

STC has continued to maintain our recreation grounds at Bedford Road and Sunderland Road as well as smaller areas of public open space and play equipment within Sandy and Beeston. The Town Council recently agreed to take over management and maintenance of Sandy Skate Park on behalf of the community as the Sandy Skate Park Association found itself with limited funds. Sunderland Road Recreation Ground was used for the Sandy Carnival and a circus was held on this site. Local football tournaments were held at Sunderland Road Recreation Ground and at Bedford Road Recreation Ground. A fun fair was held at the Pinnacle field.

The Jenkins Pavilion at Sunderland Road has been made available for community use particularly by our local football and cricket clubs throughout the year. However, the council was disappointed not to secure a wider use of the building and earlier this year took the decision to contract out management of the facility to Stevenage Leisure Limited for the financial year 2012/13. This decision will allow the facility to be marketed and promoted to users as a more integral part of the Sandy Sports and Leisure Centre offer. As far as the Sandy Sports and Leisure Centre as a whole is concerned, the Town Council has continued to work closely with Central Bedfordshire Council to represent the views of the community of Sandy. Our stated position remains that we wish to see the Sports and Leisure Centre kept open for everyone who

lives, works and studies in Sandy and the surrounding area. Our financial contribution of £9,000 during the year helped to keep the Centre open. We have not been asked for a financial contribution in 2012/13 but the future for the Centre after March 2013 remains uncertain as Central Bedfordshire Council is now reviewing its Leisure Strategy and is not expected to report on this until late 2013. However, Sandy Town Council continues to campaign for the retention of this important facility in our community.

The Pinnacle and The Riddy Nature Reserve have been maintained by the Council with the specialist support of BRCC and the Wildlife Trust and have been made available for public enjoyment. The Council thanks the volunteers who have worked tirelessly to improve the Riddy and the Pinnacle, generously donating large amounts of time and labour to working parties throughout the year.

### **Planning**

The Town Council has reviewed 86 planning applications sent to us by our planning authority, Central Bedfordshire Council for comments. We have also observed the progress through the planning system of the Tesco store application. This links to widely held concerns within the community about traffic management on Station Road and New Road and during the year STC has explored issues related to this with CBC, the Highways agency and our local MP. We continue to work in partnership with the relevant agencies to pursue these concerns further. Sandy's position on the A1, the impact of this road on our community and the gateways and access through our town will no doubt continue to concern the Council in the coming year too.

### **Tourism and Visitors**

Unlike many local councils Sandy Town Council provides a Tourist Information service and our Tourist Information Centre (TIC) has been open to the public 5 days per week throughout the year. The purpose of this service is to encourage and support visitors to Sandy and the surrounding area as well as providing information about tourism in the UK to our residents. The TIC produces a monthly "What's On" guide which is widely disseminated in the area and we have run a series of guided walks and talks which have been popular as part of our wider strategy of encouraging walking visitors to the

area. Sandy TIC has been spearheading the local campaign to secure Walkers are Welcome status for Sandy.

### **Staff**

The Staff Team has remained stable during the year and the Town Clerk has now completed one year in post. The Council has only 12 permanent employees, several of whom are part time workers. The payroll costs of the council represent a significant slice of its expenditure but it is only through employing this team that our diverse range of services can be provided. The council provides continual professional development and training for its employees and several have been successful in attaining recognition of their high standards of performance, e.g. the Town Clerk was recently awarded the David Trafford Memorial Prize by the University of Gloucestershire for excellent academic performance combined with a contribution to the Clerk's profession in the UK.


