SUBJECT: STC and CBC Quarterly Meeting Summary

1. Report Summary

- 1.1 The Mayor and Deputy Mayor attend quarterly meetings with Sandy's three Central Bedfordshire Council Councillors. The purpose of the meeting is to update and share information and continue to build on the relationship between the two Councils.
- 2.2 The latest meeting was held on Thursday 3rd August 2017. The following report is a summary of the main points covered.

2. Summary of Meeting

- 2.1 The meeting was attended by all three CBC ward Councillors and points covered included;

(a) Winchester Road

Confirmation that funding has been obtained for improvements to the Winchester Road estate. CBC have a dedicated officer working on the project and the preparation of plans for the area is currently being looked into.

CBC are liaising with Aragon Housing to get further support for the improvements and are looking for other potential funding sources to help meet project costs. Future consideration needed by Sandy Town Council as to whether they may be able to provide any funding via the Rural Match Fund to support the project.

(b) Orchard Road Beeston

The HGV weight restriction is in place and signs have been installed at the Beeston Green end of Orchard Road. CBC Cllr T Stock is investigating if similar signs will be installed at the entrance to Beeston Road from the A1.

(C) Cottage Road

To note that CBC Cllrs have pursued resurfacing works to Cottage Road and that this is due to be carried out in October 2017, subject to ensuring there is not a clash with work scheduled by the National Grid.

(d) Parking Restrictions Sandy

CBC Councillor Maudlin is liaising with CBC officers on the Clerk's behalf to chase up requested parking survey results.

(e) Story in Stone Project

To note that phase one of the project has been completed. It was noted that the Project Manager hoped to relocate Sandy's first mosaic to a more prominent location during phase 2 installations. CBC Councillors offered the Clerk their support in working with landlords to secure the best locations for the mosaics.

(e) Police and Crime Commissioner

CBC Councillors provided feedback on a meeting with Bedfordshire's Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) and confirmed that they asked that the PCC to attend a meeting with Sandy Town Council.

Cllr Maudlin has initiated contact and the Clerk is to follow up with a formal invite to the PCC. CBC Councillors suggested it would be a good idea to find out and raise local parishes concerns as well.

(f) Beeston Green Allotment Project

CBC Councillors continue to monitor the project's progress and Cllr T Stock provided the latest update from CBC officers. The outline Planning application is currently awaiting approval following the recent amendment to the plan.

- 1.1 As Members have previously been made aware, Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has secured funding for improvement works to the Winchester Road area. As stated in the notes from the CBC/STC quarterly meeting CBC have an officer dedicated to the project and they are currently looking into drawing up plans for the area.
- 1.2 CBC have been liaising with Aragon Housing to get support for the improvements and discussions are ongoing. While some funding has been secured it is unlikely that it will meet the total costs of the project and CBC are continuing to look for other sources of funding.
- 1.3 Once costs of the project are known Sandy Town Council may wish to consider supporting the work via the Rural Match Fund.

2. Information

- 2.1 The Central Bedfordshire Council Rural Match Fund is designed to help local town and parish councils fund infrastructure schemes in their area with match funding from CBC. This allows improvements which are not prioritised to get funding.
- 2.2 At this stage the plans and costs of the project are not known but Members may wish to consider whether in principle they would like the Town Council to look at making a contribution to the project via the match fund process to help build the required funds needed for any improvements. Central Bedfordshire Council will be looking to secure funds from various sources to help ensure improvement works can go ahead.
- 2.3 If the Council wishes to consider providing an element of match funding a further report will be brought to Council as soon as an outline of the project and estimated costs are available.

Subject: Report of the SG19 Group meeting held on Tuesday 1st August 2017

1. Summary

1.1 Cllr N Aldis is the Council's representative on the SG19 Group. The following report is a summary of SG19's latest meeting for Members information.

2. Report of SG19 meeting held on 1st August 2017

2.1 A representative from Highways England came to address the Group about the A1 and progress on the Strategic Route Study. He explained that for every £1 spent in construction there must be £2 in benefits. It was explained that it was hard to find this level of return for the A1 through Bedfordshire as air pollution, improvement to the environment and reducing queueing traffic east and west of the roundabouts were not considered as benefits which could be included in the calculation.

2.2 The A1 is not busy enough all day. There is mainly only a problem at morning and evening rush hours although these last much longer during school terms and on a Friday afternoon.

2.3 It appears that grade separations at Biggleswade north & south may be the only improvements unless it is possible to have a local by-pass around Beeston and Sandy.

2.4 The upgrade to the A421 with the resulting improvements at the Black Cat roundabout which included extensive work on the existing line of the A1 would make it more difficult to provide an alternative option.

2.5 It was not explained what would happen to future development if the A1 was to stay on its existing alignment as many schemes were dependent on there being a new route for the road.

SUBJECT: Future of the A1

1. Summary

- 1.1 In recent months Parish Councils along the A1 have been considering how any future changes suggested in study documentation may affect them. Sandy Town Council does not have an official position on changes/improvements to the A1 or a change of route.
- 1.2 The Town Council has always maintained that any changes are critical to the future development of the area and must be clarified if Central Bedfordshire is to develop a feasible Local Plan and should be understood prior to allocation of any further housing to this area.
- 1.3 A Strategic Study released on the A1 East of England Stage 3 Report proposed three packages to improve the A1.
- 1.4 Members are asked to consider the information currently available and whether the Town Council is in a position to agree a formal position on the future of the A1 which could be clearly communicated to relevant authorities.

2. Information

- 2.1 The three packages for this area of the A1 outlined in the Strategic Study Report can be summarised as follows;

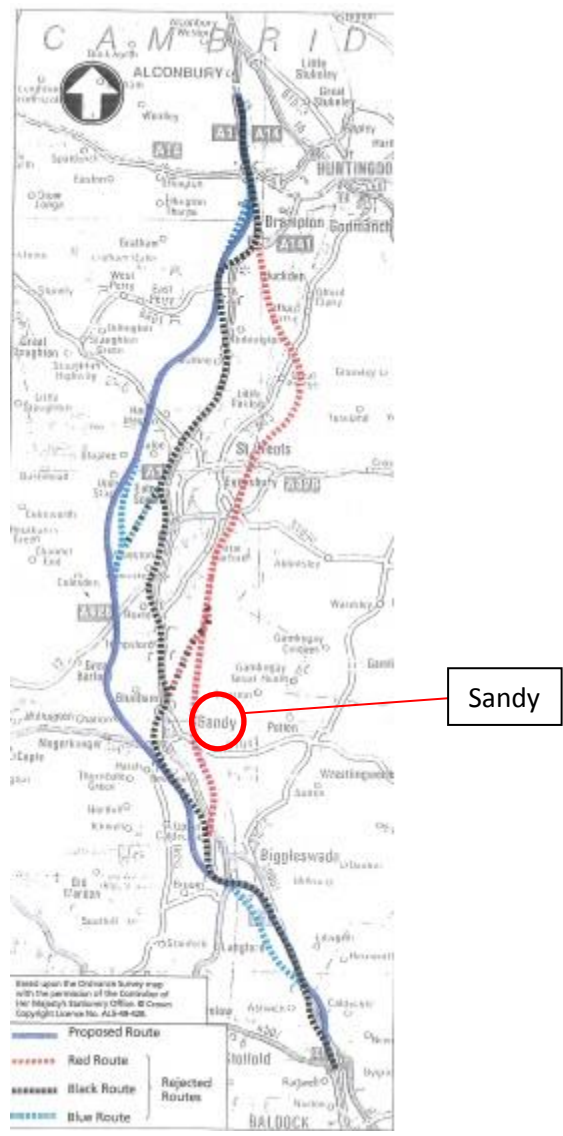
Package A – The creation of a whole new road either to the west or east of the existing A1. Although a line was drawn to the west in the strategic study, Highways England have stated that the purpose of this was to simply act as an illustration of a new route and no new route has actually been proposed.

Section 1.6.6 of the report mentions land take and severance of Ickwell Bury. This is to the west of the current A1 near Biggleswade. In the 1994 report on moving the A1 it was found that a route to the east was not feasible because more rivers need crossing, in addition it was on a flood plain and they would have to cross the railway line.

Package B – The removal of roundabouts and introduction of local improvements and local bypasses. There appear to be few details about what would be involved at this stage.

Package C - The improvement of some roundabouts near Hatfield area with no action to help alleviate the problems on the current A1.

- 2.2 There is no guarantee any of the three packages will be progressed and Highways England are due to decide whether to move forward on any of these packages by the end of 2017.
- 2.3 Staploe Parish Council have indicated support of Package B and expressed this to Alistair Burt MP, Tom Wootton, Highways England, Bedford Borough Council and the BATPC representative on the Strategic Study group.
- 2.4 In 1994 a public consultation was held on a scheme to move the A1. An image showing the route proposed at the time is included below for information.

- 1.1 At an extraordinary meeting of the Council on 24 July 2017 the Council resolved that in principle Sandy Town Council broadly supported the Draft Local Plan subject to a number of concerns which were outlined. It was also resolved that the Council does not support housing development to the north of Sandy but does support the development of an industrial or science site to the north. Should any housing be allocated to Sandy in the future, it should be allocated to the east of the town.
- 1.2 The landowner of land to the east of Sandy, which was put forward to Central Bedfordshire Council during its call for sites, has contacted the Council to enquire whether the Mayor and Clerk would want to be in attendance at a meeting with CBC for information purposes.
- 1.3 The following report is a summary of the landowner's comments for Members information. Members are asked to consider whether the Council should send representation to a proposed meeting with CBC.

2. Information

- 2.1 The landowners of land to the east of Sandy wished to make Council aware of their response to the current consultation, which can be summarised as follows;
 - Concern over enormous, long term detrimental impact on Sandy if the Tempsford site were to be developed.
 - Tempsford development is reliant on developing new road and rail connections. If the east west rail connection were to be established with a new station in the Tempsford zone, the situation of Sandy station would be in question. People would be drawn to a new station to take advantage of the new options. The new and more modern centre would similarly draw people away from Sandy centre.
 - The Tempsford development would be extremely costly and would not start selling new houses for at least 5 years after the site development commences, due to the huge infrastructure that needs to be installed at the

front end. The sorts of numbers that are suggested means that it is unlikely that the total housing outlined could all be built by the end of the plan period.

- If Tempsford goes ahead this could risk a ribbon development from St Neots to Sandy, creating a dormitory suburb without a complete centre. Sandy would become a part of it at the bottom of the chain.
 - The proposed rail route and siting of the station are those put forward by CBC, not by the rail consortium. The consortium has put forward 4 alternative routes, none of which go through Tempsford.
 - To help established communities, like Sandy, then the best place to locate the new crossing - and new station - would be just north of the town as it is today. It could bring new and varied development to the town if it was all planned properly. The present Sandy station site is not big enough to allow an enlarged station with a crossing to be built there.
 - Development to the east and partly to the north would result in a more rounded and possibly more centralised town, possibly enabling a road access to link to the Blunham A1 link. Housing would be available here more quickly than the equivalent at Tempsford because the new infrastructure required would be less.
- 2.2 The Landowners intend to seek a meeting with a high-level officer/Councillor in CBC to put their response to the Consultation across and have enquired whether Sandy Town Council would wish to send representation to such a meeting.

1.1 At a meeting of the Policy, Finance and Resources committee on 31 July 2017 the Clerk informed Members that the outdoor team were to begin the process of relocating from the current depot site and clearing the site in preparation for demolition. A Member asked that a report come back to Council.

2. Information

2.1 The site is to be cleared and demolished to allow the archaeologists access to work on and excavate the entire site at once, rather than work in stages at the same time as the demolition and building of the new depot.

2.2 Temporary storage has been agreed from 1 August 2017 and the outdoor team will have relocated from the current depot by the 21st August 2017, allowing the site to be demolished following this.

2.3 The demolition team require a minimum of 1 week's notice prior to the commencement of work and it is anticipated that they will be on site for 10 days.

2.4 At the time of writing this report, the archaeologists had not confirmed an exact date for commencement of excavation works but have indicated that they would like to get on site in September 2017.

2.5 Therefore, demolition should go ahead during the first two weeks of September to allow for the archaeologist to begin works during the end of September and into October 2017. The best-case scenario for excavation time is 3 weeks. The length of time for the excavation is dependent on what is found and could be longer than this.

2.6 The Cemetery Management Group asked that plans for the depot be amended to move the main entrance and incorporate some other minor changes. The amendment application is being drawn up by the Cemetery Development Service who drew up the original designs. This will require planning approval and as such means that the depot build would not go ahead until the new year. Plans should be ready to submit before the end of August 2017.
